Year 5 would like to say a huge thank you to Mr Hughes for arranging for them to spend the day with the Red Arrows at RAF Waddington, they had an amazing day!



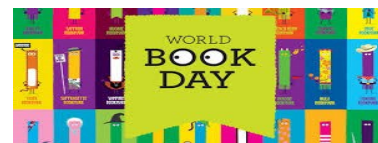
Young Voices

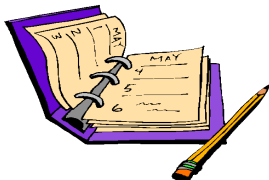
